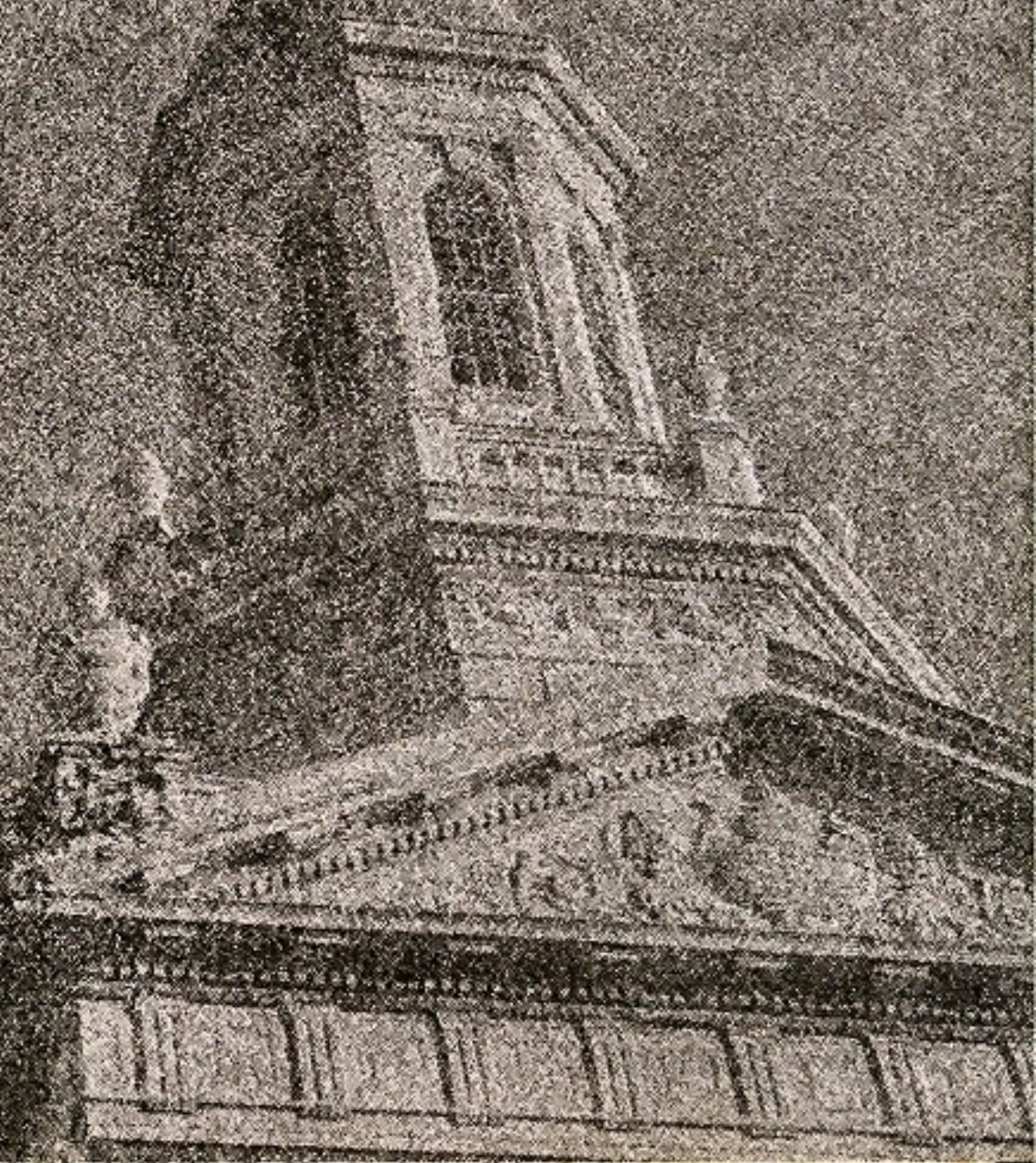
For all of you I wish a future filled with the radiance of a life of service to others and a continuous trek toward excellence.

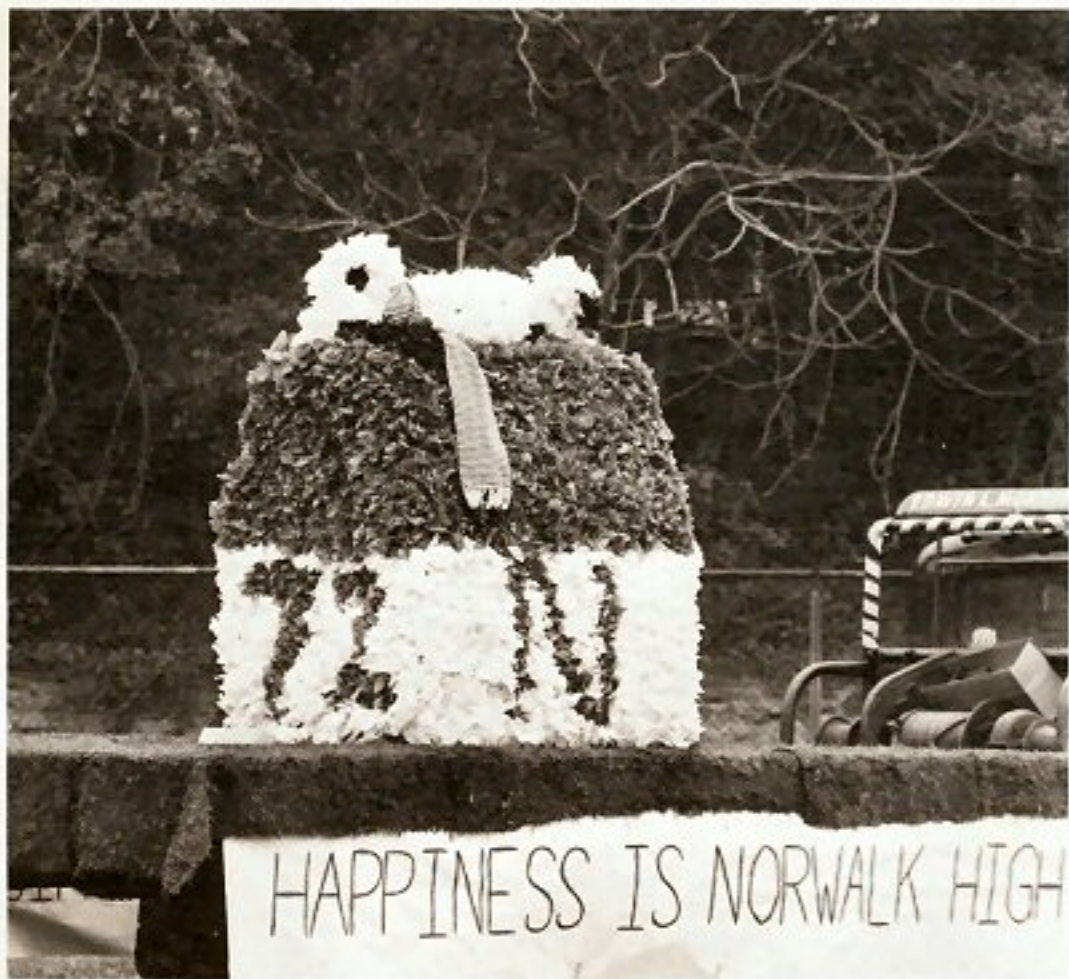

We offer Good Luck to the lower classmen and administrators for they may need it in the years to come.

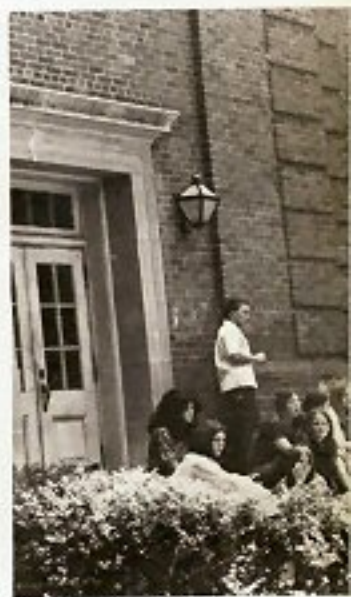
